

Demon Possession

Eph 6:11 Put on the whole armor of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

Possession: In your spirit/heart/body.

1. To occupy, dominate, or control (a person) from within: The state of being under the power of demons or invisible beings; madness; lunacy; as demoniacal possession.

Oppression: In your mind/soul/body

1. The act of oppressing; burdened with unreasonable impositions; overpowered; overburdened; depressed.
 - a. Depressed: A sinking of the spirits; dejection; a state of sadness; want of courage or animation; as depression of the mind.

Obsession: Outside the body/mind/spirit

1. The act of besieging; to dominate or preoccupy the thoughts, feelings, or desires; the first attack of Satan antecedent to possession.

Echo

2Ti 1:13 Hold fast (echo) the form of sound words, which thou hast heard of me, in faith and love which is in Christ Jesus.

1) to have, i.e. to hold

- a) to have (hold) in the hand, in the sense of wearing, to have (hold) possession of the mind (refers to alarm, agitating emotions, etc.), to hold fast keep, to have or comprise or involve, to regard or consider or hold as

2) to have, i.e. own, possess

- a) external things such as pertain to property or riches or furniture or utensils or goods or food etc.
- b) used of those joined to any one by the bonds of natural blood or marriage or friendship or duty or law etc, of attendance or companionship

3) to hold one's self or find one's self so and so, to be in such or such a condition

4) to hold one's self to a thing, to lay hold of a thing, to adhere or cling to

- a) to be closely joined to a person or a thing

"Possessed"

Act 8:7 For unclean spirits, crying with loud voice, came out of many that were possessed (echo) with them: and many taken with palsies, and that were lame, were healed.

Act 16:16 And it came to pass, as we went to prayer, a certain damsel possessed with a spirit of divination met us, which brought her masters much gain by soothsaying:

Joh 10:19 There was a division therefore again among the Jews for these sayings. 20 And many of them said, He hath (echo) a devil, and is mad; why hear ye him? 21 Others said, these are not the words of him that hath a devil (daimonizomai). Can a devil open the eyes of the blind?

Luk 8:27 And when he went forth to land, there met him out of the city a certain man, which had (echo) devils long time, and ware no clothes, neither abode in *any* house, but in the tombs. 28 When he saw Jesus, he cried out, and fell down before him, and with a loud voice said, what have I to do with thee, Jesus, *thou* Son of God most high? I beseech thee, torment me not. 29 (For he had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. For oftentimes it had caught him: and he was kept bound with chains and in fetters; and he brake the bands, and was driven of the devil into the wilderness.)

Daimonizomai

1) to be under the power of a demon.

"Possessed" used 25 times, 23 possessed with devil, 1 vexed, 1 hath

Mat 4:24 And his fame went throughout all Syria: and they brought unto him all sick people that were taken with divers diseases and torments, and those which were possessed with devils, and those which were lunatick, and those that had the palsy; and he healed them.

Mat 8:28 And when he was come to the other side into the country of the Gergesenes, there met him two possessed with devils, coming out of the tombs, exceeding fierce, so that no man might pass by that way.

Mat 9:32 As they went out, behold, they brought to him a dumb man possessed with a devil. **33** And when the devil was cast out, the dumb spake: and the multitudes marvelled, saying, It was never so seen in Israel.

Mat 12:22 Then was brought unto him one possessed with a devil, blind, and dumb: and he healed him, insomuch that the blind and dumb both spake and saw.

Katadunasteuō

1) to exercise harsh control over one, to use one's power against one

2) to oppress one

“Oppressed” – only 2 times in bible

Act 10:38 How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him.

Jam 2:6 But ye have despised the poor. Do not rich men oppress you, and draw you before the judgment seats?
